Care Management Program Patient Rights and Responsibilities

PATIENT RIGHTS

- You have the right to know about the philosophy and characteristics of the Care Management Program.
- 2. You have the right to have personally identifiable health information shared by the Care Management Program in accordance with state and federal law.
- 3. You have the right to receive respect from Care Management Program staff, including the right to know the identity of the staff member by first name, and to speak with a supervisor of the staff member within a reasonable period of time after requesting to do so (usually within 1 business day).
- 4. You have the right to receive accurate information from the Care Management Program.
- 5. You have the right to receive administrative information regarding changes in, or termination of, the Care Management Program.
- 6. You have the right to decline participation, revoke consent, or dis-enroll at any time by making your desire known to AIMM by phone, fax, e-mail, or letter (contact information included below).

PATIENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. You have the responsibility to give accurate clinical / medical and contact information and to notify the Care Management Program of changes in this information.
- 2. You have the responsibility to discuss your participation in AIMM's Care Management Program with your physicians and provide them with any information obtained from this program.
